## Frank Carey 1925

3 sport athlete... 9 varsity letters ... football, basketball, and baseball... Earning three letters for each sport...Captain of the 1924 Dedham High Baseball Team...The very first Dedham High School Athlete to be elected to the Greater Boston All-Scholastic Team and accomplished this in consecutive seasons in 1924-1925 as a second baseman...Named as the All-Scholastic Second Baseman of Greater Boston by the sporting editor of the Boston American...Scored a 62 yard touchdown against a Haverhill team that had not been scored on in two years...A defensive force on the basketball court, Frank was also high scorer for 3 consecutive seasons on the basketball team... Graduated Dedham High School as Class President in 1925...Continued his athletic success as a member of the 1926 undefeated baseball team at Dean Academy...Received an athletic scholarship to Georgetown University and given a honorary degree, a Doctor of Commercial Sciences, from Suffolk University in 1960.



## Robert A. McDonough 1942

Earned 9 varsity letters...Two in football, three in hockey, and four in baseball... A tremendous athlete gaining recognition from coaches, players, and teammates...As a Senior he was selected for the Boston Post All-Scholastic Football Team for his Defense...Voted to the Eastern Mass Hockey All-Stars as a forward and given First Team recognition... Nominated as captain of the Dedham High School Football Team as a freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior by his coaches and peers...After high school Robert took on a year at Northeastern University before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force earning a position as a Gunner where he died in action serving his country in only his second mission to Germany from England.

## Ted Walker

Earning recognition for his years of dedication to Dedham High School, the coaches, and the student athletes...President of the Dedham High Boosters Club 1975-1984...Responsible for the construction of a new concession stand at Stone Park...Set events in motion for the Boosters to purchase a camcorder for the athletic department allowing Dedham to be one of the first in the Bay State Conference with this technology...Established a scholarship fund with the Dedham High School Boosters Club which continues today...Started Booster Bingo which has continued to be a success...Continued efforts to raise funds by purchasing pizza ovens and pop corn machines through the Boosters Club ...Started the first three seasons Sports Award Nights... Responsible for the bringing in Bob Stutman's Drug Program to Dedham, "Not My Kid"...Supported Dedham Sports 110%.



## John Dooley

John Dooley may not have started or ended his coaching career here at Dedham High School, but in his eleven years as Head Hockey Coach he has raised the bar for all coaches to strive for...Prior to earning the position as head hockey coach a Dedham John Dooley was an assistant coach a Roxbury Latin working with baseball, soccer, and football...In 1962 John started an impressive eleven year stint as head hockey coach earning an overall record of 96-58-27... With this record came six appearances in state tournament competitions one semi-final bid in 1964 and two quarter-final showings in 1966 & 1969...Inducted into the Massachusetts Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame...Earned the Dedham Chamber of Commerce Achievement award in 1969...After Dedham John moved on to coaching at Mass. Bay Community College...In his seven years at Mass. Bay he coached the 1975 New England Champions with a record of 16-0 and earned a NJCAA Region XX Coach of the year in 1976...John eventually moved on to coach the Harvard Woman's Ice Hockey program from 1982-1993...In this time he had achieved an overall record of 165-118-9, three Ivy League Champions, four Ivy League Tournament Champions, seven ECAC Tournament Appearances, Three Beanpot Champions, one All American Tournament Champion, 1987 A.W.H.C.A. Coach of the Year, and awarded the A.W.H.C.A. Burke Award 1994.



## Joseph Katchpole 1963

Two-sport athlete...Earning a total of 5 letters: 3 for indoor track, 2 for outdoor track...ET Peterson Award winner in 1963...Boston Herald All-Scholastic winner in 1963...Dedham High record holder for the 300 and 440 yard dash...Class B State Champion and record holder 300 yard dash... Undefeated in Bay State competition for the 300 and 440 yard sprints... New England qualifier 440 yard dash...Second place BAA Championship 300 yard dash...New England Championship meet representative from Massachusetts 440 yard sprint...Athletic Scholarship recipient from Boston University... Continued success after Dedham High School competing for four years a BU along side 3 Olympians...Head track coach at Norwood High School... Coached league championship teams in cross country, indoor and outdoor track...Coached Class C championship team in 1988...Awarded the Boston Globe Coach of the Year 1988.



## James McCann 1964

A single sport athlete he earned letters all three of the years that he was on the Dedham High School hockey team...His devotion to the game paved the way to earn a two year starting position as the varsity goaltender after a single season as a back-up goalie...His skill and tenacity earned him the respect from not only the coaching staff and his teammates, but from his opponents as well...Earning a state tournament bid in 1964 would prolong the season into March allowing Jim and his teammates a memorable win against Gloucester in the Boston Arena... Recognized for his skill on the ice James was selected for the Bay State League All-Star Team and second team All-Scholastic in 1964... Earned a Scholarship to Boston University where he continued his hockey career... As a Terrier he was a three year starter on the varsity squad...Jim compiled an overall record of 38-17-2, a 2.85 goals against average and a save percentage of .891... Awarded the M.V.P. in 1968 at the Boston Christmas Tournament and the infamous Beanpot Tournament...To this day the love of the game continues with lacing up the skates twice a week to play defense on a men's team.

### Laurie Pilotte 1998

Three-sport athlete...Earning a total of 8 letters: 2 for soccer, 2 for cross country where she was also elected captain her senior year, and 4 letters in basketball...With all Laurie Pilotte's successes in athletics, it was her achievements on the basketball court which made her acceptance into the athletic hall of fame an easy decision... Dedham High School All time leading scorer with 1,690 points...Three time M.V.P. as a sophomore, junior, and senior...holds the record for most points in a season at 567...Career average at 20 points per game...1,000th point scored as a junior...Three time Bay State Conference leading scorer: senior year 24.7 ppg, junior year 22.3 ppg, and as a sophomore 21.3ppg...Participated on a team that made it's first tournament appearance in 11 years with it's first tournament win in over 15 years...In the tournament averaging 27 points in two games and the following year returned to the tournament averaging 25.5 points post season play...Daily Transcript Player of the year 1998...Three time Daily Transcript All-Star...Two time Herget Division Bay State Conference M.V.P....Three time Bay State Conference First Team All-Star...Boston Globe All-Scholastic as a senior...Boston Herald All-Scholastic as a senior...Massachusetts Basketball Coaches Association Best 80 All-Star Game...Listed in USA Today as one of the top players in Massachusetts her senior year.



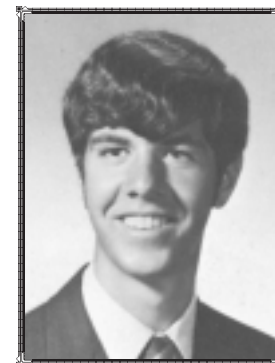
### Nancy Hanlon Lyons 1972

Three-sport letter winner and active student athlete... Earning a total of 9 letters: 3 for field hockey, 2 for basketball, and 4 for softball...Recognized by her peers as Co-Captain of the field hockey, basketball, and softball teams in her senior year...M.V.P. award winner of the 1972 softball team...Winner of I & A Outstanding Female Athlete award 1972...Booster Club Scholarship recipient 1972...National Honors Society member and Class Secretary in both her junior and senior years...Continued to be involved with athletics after Dedham by playing a year of field hockey and softball at Bridgewater State College...Coached field hockey, basketball, and softball at Mansfield High School...Recognized as Coach of the Year in 1980...Played soccer competitively on women's teams in Foxboro, Cambridge and New Haven Connecticut 1978-1996...Ran in 19 marathons including 14 Boston Marathon with a 19th place finish in the women's masters division...Received the Friend of M.I.A.A. Award in 1992...and is currently Associate Director of Athletics for Intercollegiate Services/Senior Woman Administrator at Northwestern University.



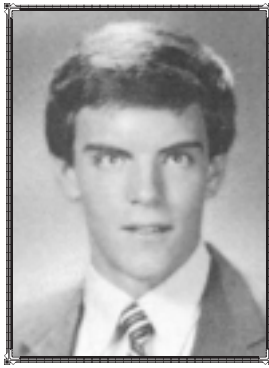
### William Littleton 1972

Single sport athlete earning letters each of the three years he was on the Dedham High School basketball team...Co-Captain for the 1971-1972 undefeated Bay State League Champion Basketball Team...Awarded the Dedham Chamber of Commerce Basketball M.V.P....Three time League All-Star...Winner of the Bay State League M.V.P. in 1972...1972 Boston Globe All-Scholastic...1972 Boston Herald All-Scholastic... 1972 Patriot Ledger All-Scholastic...After Dedham received honorable mention at the 1973 All New England Prep School Team at Worcester Academy averaging 18 points and 15 rebounds per game...two year League All Star in the Mass. State Conference for Westfield State...Recognized by coaches and players by being named as captain for the Westfield State Men's Basketball Team 1976-1977.



## James Keohane 1984

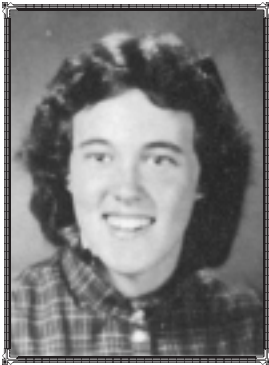
Three-sport athlete...earned 11 letters with 3 in cross country, 4 in indoor track, and 4 in outdoor track...Member of the 4 x 1 mile state record outdoor relay team...Member of the Class C State Champion cross country team three consecutive years...Member of the Bay State League cross country champion team two consecutive years...Class C State indoor and outdoor mile Champ as a junior and senior... All-State outdoor mile Champ as a junior...5th place at the Eastern State Indoor Championships for the 1 mile...2nd place at the Eastern State Indoor Championships for the 2 mile...Setting a state record as a junior with the time of 4:17 in the mile...Dedham High School Records include the indoor mile 4:17.3, outdoor mile 4:17.2, cross country 2.95 mile course 14:21...Awarded the ET Peterson Award for outstanding track athlete 1984...Continued to compete in the NCAA for Dartmouth College for four years.

## Katie Tighe Downing 1984

Three-sport athlete...Earning a total of 10 letter with 4 in soccer, 2 in basketball, and 4 for girls outdoor track...Katie was highly regarded by her coaches and teammates by be named as Captain for all three sports as a senior...Played on the Bay State League Championship Soccer Team in 1981...In 1983 her soccer skills also earned her a Bay State League All-Star, Patriot Ledger All-Star, and a Daily Transcript All-Star...On the basketball court Katie received recognition by being selected as the Team M.V.P., Bay State League All-Star and Daily Transcript All-Star for the 1983-1984 season...On the girls outdoor track team Katie excelled and was awarded the Team M.V.P. in 1984...Held the school record for the javelin for 15 years...Winner of the Class B State Meet for the javelin in 1983...Winner of the Bay State League Conference Meet in the javelin for 3 consecutive years...Member of the Bay State Championship Team in 1981, 1983, 1984...Patriot Ledger All-Star 1983...Daily Transcript Sophomore of the Year 1982...Daily Transcript All-Star three consecutive years...and Daily Transcript M.V.P. 1984.



The 1989 Girls Track Team did not win one Bay State League Championship, they won four...Besides the outstanding individual achievements, League Records, Conference Records, and School Records, as a team these girls had established a four year record of 34 wins – 0 losses – 2 ties...Although many times these girls were alone participating in their individual events they had an entire team cheering for them and supporting them with every step...
