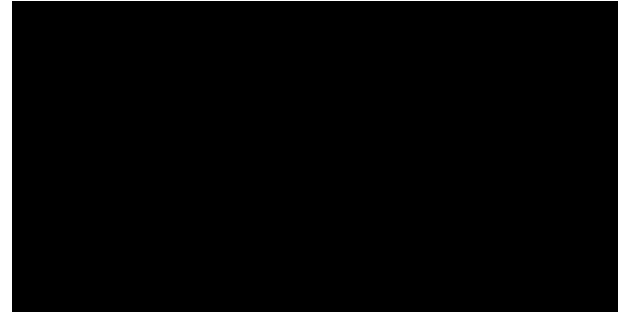


Martin Luther King Jr Celebration Student Artwork! (K-5)
