Wednesday, November 2, 2022

Today was the 40th day of school for the 2022-23 school year. There are only 140 days left this year. A reminder that next Tuesday, November 8 will be the district's third and final full day of professional development for faculty and staff. As all of you are aware, Monday was Halloween and there were plenty of kids excited to trick-or-treat that evening. Our DELTA program did their annual Halloween Parade at DHS. Below are our DELTA students and staff and the DHS students who are completing internships in the program:







ECEC Principal Kim Taylor and Visual Arts Department Chair Bridget O'Leary will be presenting at this week's **National Association of Elementary School Principals fall convening**. Kim Taylor is also on the Advisory Board for the fall convening. Bridget will be presenting "Early Childhood Art Education: It is Not Just Finger Painting" this Thursday, and Principal Taylor will be presenting two sessions for Principals on Saturday: "Thoughtful Themes: Setting the Stage for a Successful Year" and "Let Them Play". SBRC Chair John Tocci, Dedham Town Manager Leon Goodwin, SC Chair Melissa Pearrow and I participated in the <u>MSBA Designer Selection Panel</u> on Tuesday, 11/1/22. We were 3 of the 16 voting members on the <u>designer selection panel</u> <u>process</u>. I am sure there will be more about this session discussed in the SubCommittee portion of the meeting.

On Tuesday night this week I participated in the Avery PTO Meeting with Oakdale MSBA Project OPM Compass/Vertex. There were about 25 parents in attendance and we discussed the scope and sequence of the pending MSBA Oakdale project and answered many questions from the group. HERE is a draft of the project "community update" flier that will be available at the Mini Town Meeting.

Over the past two weeks I have participated in the <u>DESE Influence 100 Program</u> as a part of the Department's Center for Strategic Initiatives. I am pleased to report that Dedham is one of only about a dozen districts selected to participate in this program that seeks to create more culturally responsive districts and leaders across the Commonwealth, and promote better outcomes for students. Dr. Fox Roye (Cohort 3) and Oakdale Principal Kim Hermesch (Cohort 4) are both enrolled in this DESE leadership program.

On Thursday last week Dr. Fox Roye and I participated in the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents MASS REDI Conference. There are 61 school districts across the state that are getting together 6 times over the course of this year to share best practices around Racial Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (REDI) initiatives. We learned about the many different approaches that districts are using to achieve better outcomes for students, and how to best design our efforts strategically with an awareness of the unique situations present in every community.

<u>Cultural Appreciation Week</u> was celebrated last week by Massachusetts Trial courts across the state. The Dedham Session of the Norfolk County Juvenile Court hosted an art exhibit by Dedham High School students under the direction of DHS Art teacher Amy Vega and Visual Arts Department Chair Bridget O'Leary. Each student's work of art reflects this year's Cultural Appreciation Week theme: Out of Many, We Are ONE: Equal Justice for ALL. This was an excellent opportunity for our students to partner with the community on a collaborative art project.

Norfolk County Juvenile Court Probation Case Specialist Scharliea DaRoza and Ms. Vega went to great efforts coordinating the event. Each student's work of art is displayed throughout the courthouse. Ms. DaRoza prepared a montage compiling each of the students' art work. Committee members are welcome to visit the courthouse and view the students' work.

Boys and girls cross country are both competing in the Coaches Invitational meet and Kevin Cronin qualified for the Division 2 Sectional Championships in golf.

Congratulations to all the athletes and coaches on their successful fall seasons!


COVID-19 Update

Information gathered over the summer as <u>COVID-19 data for Dedham</u> shows a very small, incremental decrease in cases registered in the town over the past 2 weeks. This trend continues a pattern of up-and-down case numbers going back to mid-July.

The <u>CDC continues to list Norfolk County in the "Moderate" community level</u> <u>category by their designation criteria.</u> The MWRA COVID-19 concentrations in wastewater over the past two weeks have declined VERY SHARPLY from the steep

rise of late September. Please take a look at the MWRA graph below to be aware of the most current trends in Dedham and surrounding areas. This information is updated every Thursday with the previous week's data. More comprehensive information may be obtained from the MWRA COVID-19 wastewater surveillance website.
