

Federal & State Mandates Legal Requirements

- Pre-referral (Student Assistance Teams, RtI, etc.)
- Child Find
- Early Childhood
- Evaluations and eligibility (Additional requirements for Autism Spectrum Disorders)
- IEPs and placement (a Free & Appropriate Public Education in the Least Restrictive Environment, ensuring educational progress)
- School Discipline & Bullying Prevention
- Transitional Planning
- Provision of Compensatory Services (where regression or provision of services is jeopardized)
- Assurances of Civil Rights
- Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC)

Other Pandemic Challenges

- Paradigm shift in how special education delivers a high quality education
 - Engaging children with a virtual education
 - Prioritizing consistent in-person learning for students with highest needs
 - Providing supplies, materials, accommodations for equal access
 - Meeting state and federal requirements for compensatory services
- Responding to increased mental health issues
- Meeting compensatory service mandates
- Supporting parents/guardians serving as educators




DPS Key Initiatives


- Prioritizing special education students with highest needs
 - Ensuring continuity of instruction
 - Providing compensatory services where required
- Creative alternatives for specialized instruction (Instructional Learning Plans, Google slide decks, supply boxes, communication logs)
- Remote and in-person Assessment
- Targeted Professional Development
- Remote IEP Meetings; annual reviews, evaluations/re-evaluations
- Consideration of compensatory services at all IEP Meetings
- Robust Extended School Year (ESY) Services; staff provided with additional time to create alternatives for specialized instruction

DPS Assessment Approaches


- New Thinking
 - Tele-Assessment versus face to face assessment
 - Record Reviews
 - Use of Questionnaires
 - Consideration of portfolios, projects, and performance tasks
- Contracting for in-person assessments
 - For high needs students
 - For students with serious mental health issues
- Postponing and/or Waiving Assessments
 - By mutual agreement with home and school
 - For students with serious attentional or sensory issues
 - For students who cannot manipulate specialty materials

Short term expansion of ECEC Program	\$ 42,000
Compensatory Costs (funded by CARES, ESSER & Circuit Breaker)	
Materials to support remote learning and assessment	\$ 30,000
• Specialized Assessment Needs (mental health)	\$32,000
Compensatory Services	\$ 350,000+

RESULTS & LESSONS LEARNED

Results & Lessons Learned

- Compliance with special education mandates prevented litigation
- Remote IEP meetings promoted increased parent/guardian participation and efficiencies in the IEP meeting process
- A preemptive approach to compensatory services offset the loss of academic, therapeutic, and/or life skills
- Robust in-district special education programs and in-person learning options supported continued stability in out-of-district placements and costs.
- In-district programs strengthened by targeted professional learning opportunities
