Members of the DEA attended the meeting. Mr. Tim Dwyer, HS Social Studies teacher and DEA President read a prepared statement to the Committee. "The professional educators of the Dedham Public Schools have an urgent message - settle this contract fairly." Members of the group presented gift packages from each of the schools symbolizing donated time and money teachers have spent each year over and above what they are contractually paid for. Chairman Dave Roberts read a prepared statement in response which gave a brief overview of the negotiation process to date and it is the fervent hope of the Committee to collectively strive to come to a labor agreement that does not negatively impact the future of education in Dedham.

The Committee recognized members of the DHS girls’ soccer team and Head Coach Don Savi. He introduced the seniors and captains: Cara Cocoran, Patrice Vettori, Julia Kilcoyne and Lydia Caissy. Mr. Savi thanked the assistant coaches, Coach Wallin and Coach Eisenhut who are great roll models for the girls. The girls' soccer team finished third in the Herget Division and also qualified for State Tournament play.

The Committee recognized members of the DHS football team and Head Coach Keith Comeau. Coach Comeau introduced Captain, Bernie Girard; seniors Nick Walch, Dave Sheehan, Kevin O’Brien, Nick Boudreau, Dante DeBenedictis, James Gilligan. Coach Comeau felt the great support on Thanksgiving Day contributed to the win over Norwood.

Mr. Arria spoke about Coach Comeau's efforts this year and he works tirelessly. He feels this is a turning point for the football program. Coach Savi does a tremendous job with the soccer program. They won 7 out of the last 8 Herget Division Championships. He mentioned some of the other successes this fall. The Field Hockey team made it to the state tournament. Golf competed in the State Tournament; from there one individual went onto the individual States. The Boys Soccer team made it to the state tournament into the second round. Swim and Dive team finished $7^{\text {th }}$ in Division I out of 22 teams. We had many boys and girls named to Bay State All Conference Team.

The Committee recognized Mr. Mark Whalen, Executive Vice President of Needham Bank. Mr. Arria introduced him. They have been great sponsors for Dedham Public Schools. They are donating 2 new score boards for the gymnasium. Mr. Whalen introduced his colleague Mr. William Day.

The Flu Clinic: Gail Kelly. Recognize the school nurses for participating in partnership with the Town’s Health Department in the flu clinics. Update: A clinic was held at the Middle School for children 9 and under. 350 students received vaccinations. The nurses also identified high risk students and they were offered vaccinations as well. Next week we have plans to run school based flu clinics for age 10 and up. Ms. Kelly recognized the work the nurses have done in servicing students this year with the volume of flu like symptoms, parent concerns, phone calls. The Committee welcomed the Greenlodge Student Council and Principal Kiewlicz. The advisors are: Mrs. Shevory, Miss Killgoar, and Mrs. Mucci. They are representatives to the classrooms. They oversee recycling in the classrooms. They announce performers at the sharing assemblies and help out with the lunch time learners. Programs run by the student council include: the food drive, coats for kids, letters to veterans project - 200 letters to send to soldiers in Afghanistan. An autographed picture of the Greenlodge Student Council was presented to each School Committee member.

The Committee recognized the winners of the VFW Writing Contest, "Patriots Pen". This year's essay prompt was "When is the right time to honor our military heroes? There were over two hundred entries of this fiveparagraph essay. Three Grade 6 students from the Middle School received awards. Ms. Harrington and Mr. Warren are the two $6^{\text {th }}$ grade social studies teachers.
The $3^{\text {rd }}$ place winner was Christopher Olliney, a member of the Tiger team and his favorite subject is Math. The $2^{\text {nd }}$ place winner was Amelia Amato, a member of the Olympian team and her favorite subject is Spanish. The $1^{\text {st }}$ place winner was Andrew Wilson, a member of the Olympian team and his favorite subject is Science. He was the district champion and his essay will proceed to the state championship level.

Spirit Week is held in March with DMS Pride Day. 50\% of student population made honor roll for the first term.

## REPORTS

Update on Athletic League Issues - Mr. Arria
They have met several times since last June. Similar ideas are still circulating, such as; once around league scheduling, dividing teams within the league based on strength of program, and possibly adding teams in to create a 3tier system. These are all somewhat on hold waiting on the football playoff system currently moving through MIAA committees. There are concerns among coaches this will lead to breaking up leagues for the sake of state championships and tournaments. Both Mr. Arria and Mr. Santamaria are looking for support to add teams to the league. But there is some resistance out there due to the league busting that is currently going on.
An informal vote was taken by the Athletic Directors to support the new football proposal to bring back for feedback, and Dedham was the only one who voted approval. This proposal passed today to go to the next level, which is more talking. Discussion continued with some questions asked: When is the next meeting - athletic directors meet once a month. What is the governing body for the Bay State Conference? - There is a Constitution - it was updated in 2006. How can we get the discussion moving forward? - Until the issue with football is resolved the rest is in a holding pattern. Football is driving the bus.

Sustainability Committee Presentation: Liz O’Donnell, Chairman of Sustainability Committee. We are an advisory committee to the Board of Selectmen. Our mission is to educate businesses, residences on energy conservation and sustainability. The committee has a grant from the state to run an Anti-Idling Campaign. It's unhealthy and against the law so they are working on a campaign to educate the parents. Safe Routes program is currently being run at Greenlodge. This program offers two benefits - sustainability and health. Fewer cars in front of the school and children are walking for exercise. They would like to see this program expand to the other schools. Virginia LeClair spoke about another program from NSTAR - Change a Light Program. This program is a fundraiser for the schools. It is an educational campaign on energy saving light bulbs. It was determined that Virginia LeClair would be the liaison to the Superintendent for any curriculum items. Discussion was held on erecting "anti-idling" signs at each of the schools. A suggestion was made to work with the Superintendent and Mr. Lynch to determine the best location. Ms. LeClair brought the Committee up to date on the town-wide initiative to improve energy efficiency in the school buildings and all the other municipal buildings.
