Ms. Kelly reported on the use of MRI for research in studying the brain and the effects on learning. Dr. Ribas has been providing training, 90 teachers are currently being trained. The idea behind this method is if you enter a kindergarten classroom or a high school classroom you should be able to walk in and recognize the same kind of teaching strategy whether it's at the earliest stage or the most advanced
