Accomplishments included introducing Everyday Math in Preschool, with continued support for Kindergarten teachers. Implemented Lucy Calkins Writing Program, increased the use of nonfiction text, created a summer reading/math calendar for students entering first grade. Offered parent workshops on Literacy, created bus safety rules, created a diversity committee to build cultural awareness and appreciation.

LITERACY PROGRAM - MRS. CYNTHIA KELLY

Introduced Reading Specialists and Principals.

Treasures program was implemented to grades 1,2,3 this year. Treasures is a comprehensive Reading Language Arts program developed with the goal that all students grow to be life-long readers and writers. Anticipate moving to grades 4 and 5 next year. The results are consistency across the district, comprehensive, research-based lLanguage Arts instruction, explicit and systematic teaching, alignment with Common Core State Standards, Knowledge and skills applied across all curriculum areas.

The "big five" components are: Phonemic awareness, phonics. fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. There will be a summer workshop with continued professional development and implementation in grades 4 and 5.
