SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Pleased to report that a team of HS teachers have been accepted to participate in TEC Grant and congratulate them on their willingness to participate.

Moved here about 2 months ago. She doesn't speak any English and is really behind. I offered to tutor her every day. Her math level is very good. Parents are having a hard time transferring her records, but she should be with us next week.

Dr. LaFlamme presents report on Vocabulary Development:

The vocabulary program being presented tonight has actually been phased in. One part in it's third year and one in it's first year. Combines roots, prefixes, suffixes, word families and instruction in context. Dr. LaFlamme introduced other English teachers who were present: Megan Unger, Cheryl Scarsciotti, Andrew Patterson, Sue Lyons, Liz Hegerty, Rebecca Weber.

Kelly Shultz MS, English – grade 6-12 presented:

Learning Vocabulary: Roots and Prefixes portion of program

Presented a handout to the School Committee. Ms. Shultz took the S.C. through how she uses the program in her classroom.

Carol Margolis HS, talked about the combination context roots and prefixes and introducing students to idea of getting multiple strategies for finding out definitions of unknown words. New program this year. Ms. Margolis took the S.C. through how she uses the program in her classroom.

Grade 10 MCAS Report, presented by: Mr. Santamaria, Mr. Murray, and Mr. Nelson

Sophomores continue to demonstrate progress in ELA- 82% scored Proficient/Advanced Proficient improved from 47% in 2007-55% in 2008

18% scored needs improvement in 2008 from 24% in 2007

Science results placed us tied for 7th in the entire State

Math: 85% scored Proficient/Advanced

Improved advanced scores from 50% in 2006 to 54% 2007. We are happy to be able to sustain and improve this category. The failure rate has decreased from 7% to 1%. 98% of students passed the Math MCAS test.

Science and Technology: 90% scored Proficient/Advanced in Biology, 97% passed the test.

Overall we are pleased. Thank all staff – truly a team effort. Every staff member is well versed in proctoring exams. Teachers practice MCAS type questions so students recognize the format.

Dr. LaFlamme and Mr. Hickey are also here.

Mr. Santamaria presented slides on overview of the last 4 years. The trends are significant.

Ms. Driscoll inquired about Chemistry and Technology tests – 4 students Chemistry, 5

Engineering/Technology 1 warning in Chemistry, 2 in Technology. Putting together remedial program John Murray talked about Competency Determination.

Students must pass ELA AND MATH

2009 – score 220 to satisfy requirement

NCLB – 2014 all students will need to be proficient. Massachusetts is jumping ahead: Class 2010 and beyond – 240 or above on ELA and Math. If a student scores below 240 – EPP provide services to demonstrate proficiency. One way to identify is through the Plato Math program – identify weaknesses. Princeton Review for ELA – EPP provides services in after school programs. Students that have been identified will need to take these courses in order to graduate.

Science – score of 220 or above.

Mr. Roberts had a question on how to measure proficiency.

Ms. Doe commented they can use other diagnostics to document proficiency.

Ms. Matthews wanted to point out we've spent years getting where we are and she can't let this moment go by without lauding everyone – this is a day for celebration. Sustained achievement not a one year blip. Dedham is performing extremely well. We proved we can do it.

Thank you Mr. Santamaria and all the other administrators. It is great to create a generation of kids that are well rounded.

Mrs. Richburg had a question about EPP. Concerned about after school. Mr. Murray responded to her concerns. Meet with counselor – plan together to achieve proficiency. After school is not the only avenue. Multitude of inputs tailored to student needs.

Mrs. Richburg; Are assessments going to be at the end of the year or monthly. Mr. Santamaria responded that it would be an ongoing assessment recorded on EPP.

Grade 6-8 MCAS Report presented by Mr. Ruggere, Mr. Boles.

Pleased in direction we're headed. Thanks for the support of software last year. Plato and My Access. Identified students that will need help. Process of developing ISSP's. Slides presented:

AYP data -

This year we exceeded target 74.9 – 79.9 - CPI index score was actually 82.1.

Special Ed sub group in Math – grew 11.1 points on index – we exceeded AYP.

Did make AYP in all sub groups and overall as a school.

Grade 6: ELA 87% scored Advanced/Proficient\Open response questions are an area of concern.

Look on scale – moving in right direction

Discussed improvement plans – continue to use software.

Grade 6 Math – numbers remain same - relatively. We will be looking at closely.

Grade 7 ELA – moving in right direction\concerns in quality of open response questions.

Math – moving up

Grade 8 ELA 88% Advanced/Proficient – really pleased – great effort.\weakness in open response questions.

Math – huge leap – 52% Advanced/Proficient.\concerns, data analysis and open response.

Science – very proud of, moved from 22% to 40% Proficient. The ship has turned and we are sailing in the right direction.

Discussion held by Committee -

Open response as a weakness? Hard to capture – how are we attacking? Mr. Boles responded: more writing across the classrooms. Routine – dissecting the questions. More practice the better they get at it. Assessment drives the instruction. Ms. Matthews comment – 75% of middle schools in the State did not make AYP – we should feel proud. Concern expressed for number of kids in warning. What is the program specifically for them? Mr. Boles responded: Guidance, Teachers and Administration – developing an individual plan per student through ISSP.

Mrs. Richburg: ISSP are they state driven? Ms. Doe commented that they are mandated for failed students, Dedham does it for needs improvement. Mrs. Doe – all grades or just for 10th grade. High stakes – diploma driven. Goal is to have students pass MCAS in 10th grade. So we don't have to play catch up. ?ISSP is that information carried to HS? Does anyone look at it? Yes and yes.

Ms. Doe commented that the open response training on how students read and respond to open responses starts at elementary level.

Ms. Doe would like to acknowledge the SC and their support of Plato. Prior year 8th grade text in math. We are seeing the benefits of both of those financial commitments. Thank you.
